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DAY 1 - DEPART LOS ANGELES FOR WELLINGTON, NEW ZEALAND (TRAVEL TIME LOSE ONE DAY)

International Dateline

The International Date Line sits on the 180° line of longitude in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, and is the imaginary line that separates two consecutive calendar days. It is not a perfectly straight line and has been moved slightly over the years to accommodate needs (or requests) of varied countries in the Pacific Ocean. Note how it bends to include all of Kiribati, Samoa, Tonga and Tokelau in the Eastern Hemisphere.

So, travel east across the International Date Line results in a day, or 24 hours, being subtracted. Travel west across the International Date Line results in a day being added.

DAY 2 - ARRIVE IN NADJ, FIJI - DEPART FOR WELLINGTON, NEW ZEALAND Complete Customs & Immigration & Transfer from Wellington Airport

Accommodations - Wellington City Hotel - 3 Nights

Wellington is known as the restaurant capital of New Zealand. Many of its great cafes, funky bars and ethnic inspired restaurants are within walking distance of each other, and street performers enliven the sidewalks. Look for restaurants and bars in the Courtney Place area, namely Blair and Allen Streets, or try Queens Wharf. Wellington's nightlife is a tribute to its passion for the arts. It is home to the national orchestra, ballet and opera companies, four professional theatres and the national schools of dance and drama.

DAY 8 - DEPART QUEENSTOWN / ARRIVE FRANZ JOSEF

The spectacular Franz Josef Glacier descends to just 250 meters above sea level amidst the greenery and lushness of a temperate rainforest. Of all the accessible temperate glaciers in New Zealand, the Franz Josef Glacier is easily the steepest and fastest moving. While many glaciers world wide have been retreating, the Franz Josef Glacier still flows almost to sea level, through a temperate rainforest of ancient podocarpus trees and other evergreen species. This combination of ice and temperate rainforest is a unique feature of New Zealand's glacier country, and is an ecosystem found nowhere else in the world. Bella Vista Motel Franz Josef Glacier is a modern 18 unit property, located in the centre of the Franz Josef Glacier village, on the West Coast of the South Island. The Franz Josef Glacier Guides base is just around the corner as are helicopter flights, quad bikes, horse treks and a range of other adrenalin and adventure activities. DAY 9 - DEPART FRANZ JOSEF TO CHRISTCHURCH Accommodations - Rendezvous Hotel Christchurch - 2 Nights

The TranzAlpine scenic train journey travels between Christchurch and Greymouth, from one coast of New Zealand to the other. From your carriage, you'll see the fields of the Canterbury Plains and farmland, followed by the spectacular gorges

and river valleys of the Waimakariri River. Your train then climbs into the Southern Alps before descending through lush beech rain forest to the West Coast town of Greymouth - a great base for visits to Punakaiki and the always popular glaciers. There are 16 tunnels and 5 viaducts, the highest being the staircase standing at 73 meters.

The city of Christchurch is located just north of Banks Peninsula on the East Coast of New Zealand's South Island. It is New Zealand's only predominantly flat major city and, with a population of 300,000, it is the South Island's largest city. Because Christchurch is flat, getting around is easy, whether walking or cycling.



DAY 10 - CITY SIGHTSEEING CHRISTCHURCH'S "MUST SEE THREE"

The tour commences in the morning and visits three of Christchurch's top attractions. First stop is the International Antarctic Centre, a winner of the New Zealand Tourism Board's award for 'Best Visitor Attraction'. The Centre recreates the atmosphere of Antarctica providing an interactive experience of the Southern Continent. The tour then moves on to Willowbank Wildlife Reserve, a large variety of birds and animal life both native and introduced. You will view the kiwis in their natural habitat and can feed and pet the animals in the reserve. Following Willobank, the tour heads to the Air Force Museum at Wigram, New Zealand's original Air Force base. The attraction has 28 fully restored aircraft together with newly refurbished static and interactive displays that dramatically enhance the visitor's experience.

DAY 11 - DEPART FOR NADI, FIJI / ARRIVE LAUTOKA Accommodations - First Landing Resort and Villas - 3 Nights

Fiji Visa Information

All foreign nationals entering Fiji are required to possess a valid international travel document in the form of a national Passport. It is required that Passports have a validity of at least six months beyond the intended date of departure from Fiji. Foreign nationals are issued with Visitor Permits on arrival for stays exceeding 4 months, which may be extended on application for up to two months at a time for an aggregate of six months. Travellers must hold a passport with one blank visa page and hold proof of onward/return flights. For more information go to: www.cibtvisas.com/goway.
